Certified Nursing Assistant

The Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course prepares students for employment as a nursing assistant under the supervision of professional licensed nurses. This course includes First Aid/CPR for healthcare professionals as well as Washington State required HIV/AIDS and HIPAA training. Upon successful completion, students are eligible to take the Washington State written manual skills examination to become CNAs. Current immunizations and Washington State Patrol background check required.
